A scroll with 7 seals is given to the Lamb (representing Jesus)

24 Elders & 4 Creatures praise the Lamb

Heavenly Court

as the only one who can open the seals

Ch6 7 Seals

Six seals are opened, and each of them is form of judgement

1-4: horses of apocalypse: Conquest, War, Judgement and Death

Ukraine: 5 recognises those who died for their faith China, Indonesia, N Korea, Iran 6 seal natural disasters like the one in Turkey This things have happened and are happening now Holding back A Rev 7·1-4 But then the scene changes While we just read all the affects of the opening of the six seals We now get a different view four angels hold the four winds the four horses of the apocalypse? So that they cannot do any damange The seals are opened, but the damage that they allow is put on hold Why?, because something else needs to happen

Another seal is introduced

The seal of the Living God

Brougth in by an angel form the rising Sun

"Do not damage the earth or the seas or the trees until we have marked the servants of our God with a seal on their foreheads"

The seal seems similar as the blood on the door posts with the 10th plague in Exodus, where God's first born children were protected from death, by the blood of sacrifice

John then hears and sees two different things

He hears a voice stating the number of people who were sealed

[△] v 4

144,000 of every tribe of Israel

12,000 per tribe of Israel

But the list of tribes is a bit different Dan is missing Levi is added Did not have land as it was the priestly tribe Joseph is normally split in Ephraim and Manasseh Manasseh is mentioned, Joseph is also but not Ephraim But the lists of tribes are not consistent throughout the Bible 144,000 is a symbol of the completeness of the people of Israel? Or those who have accepted Jesus Christ as their Messiah? As it is clearly not all Israel who are being sealed, but 'out of every tribe', a selection? But it is clear that Israel has still a seperate status than the rest of the world! John hears one thing, but

then he **sees** a different thing: ^ v 9

from every nation, every tribe, every people, every language

Robed in white

Standing before the throne and before the Lamb

Worshipping God

Memory verse

Salvation belongs to our God, who is seated on the throne, and to the lamb

The 6 seals promise a lot of
turmoil, calamity, unrest,
upheaval, death, destruction
Later on Revelation will show
more of that
Things that have happened,

And if we only read that, then we will be taken over by

are happening and will happen

despair

So in the midst of this God halts everything, so that he can seal/save the people who follow Jesus

Even though the turmoil goes around us, and will affect us as well

We all need to die

But in the midst of that

We have been sealed by the blood of Jesus

Jesus will be our shepherd

He will never leave us not forsake us

In a way its is a repeat of Jesus in Matthew saying "do not worry"

Whatever seems to happen

but first strive for the Kingdom of God and his righteousness and all these things will be given to you too

Do not worry - do not be anxious

but let yourself be guided by me

Take a seat in the tabernacle or the tent that I have put up to shelter you in

Come and wash yourselves in my blood and I will keep you save

Revelation signs may be hard

but we see the echoes of that in our daily living

In the grand scale: Ukraine, Iran, Turkey

In the small scale: cost of living, secularisation of society

But by keeping our eyes on the lamb, and by worshipping him

We are safe

He is keeping is safe!
