# The man with an unclean spirit

#### Intro

Today's passage may sound strange in our western ears

What is this talk about evil/unclean spirits?

Surely our medical profession as advanced well enough now

These must be mental diseases

Sychrophenia, perhaps?

But evil / unclean spirits do not exist, surely

And this attitude has closed our eyes to the normal Biblical worldview

A wordview that the people witnessing the acts of Jesus did not find strange

Or where countless Christians in Africa, Asia or Latin America find this perfectly normal

For the western world these experiences are relegated to the

#### ncuonai wonu

There are countless fantasy novels out there that portray a world where unclean spirits exist

And there are many people today in the western world who pay attention to wigi boards, tarrot cards, horoscopes, chrystals

And they are drawn to this, because it is real

## Spiritual Survey example

Last year we did a spiritual survey

One question: Have you ever

investigated spiritual matters?

Many in their 30ies,40ies responded yes:

crystals, tarot, budhism, hinduism
But not Christianity!

Even the people in our generation

are realising the spiritual is real

Even of science cannot prove it

And they don't realise how bad these spiritual practices are for them!

### Luke context

Start of series: Jesus in Nazareth

The last few Sundays:

18 "The Spirit of the Lord is on me, because he has anointed me

to problamingood news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim freedom for the prisoners and recovery of sight for the blind, to set the oppressed free, 19 to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor." The prophecy from Isaiah that Jesus claimed as his This is me! Nazarath could not see him like that. but saw him as the man from the village And he had to leave But was does it mean, proclaiming freedom, recovery of sight, setting oppressed free In this passage Jesus teaches that in Capernaum Not only by speech But also a demonstration of his power Man with an unclean demon Unclean demon Luke cannot make it more specific Not only was this man possessed by a demon It was unclean and it would have made the man unclean In the eyes of the religious authorities

And the demon is in charge It controls the man It even speaks through him Shouting really Grabbing the attention from Jesus' teaching Jesus' authority Jesus speaks with authority as he told the unclean demon "Be silent, and come out of him!" And the demon obeyed Jesus With a bit of drama But not harming the man himself One thing we hear often in the gospels is that Jesus spoke and acted with authority This is because he is the Son of God Many people, especially the younger generations, are looking up to people who speak with authority Because they are lost, and do not know what to chose and do in life They seek direction, and the older generations tell them: you can do what you likel But they don't know what they like There is too much choice So they search for those who claim to know If only they were looking to Jesus!

# As he has the ultimate authority Jesus sets people free This was a demonstration of Jesus purpose To set them free But from what? Jesus demonstrates what he has declared before To set the captives free What he promised he would in Nazarath He is the promised Messiah And he does this not by freeing them from the Roman occupiers But by freeing them from the bondage to evil In this man case of bondage to an evil spirit but in other cases bondage to physical ailments or bondage to religious practices He sets them free so that they can choose Jesus' word's

The passage ends with the crowds commenting with amazement

What kind of teaching is this? (NIV) What kind of utterance is this (NRSV) In Greek the word used for teaching/utterance is 'word' And we are reminded of John 1:1 "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God and the Word was God." Jesus words in teaching as well as commanding demons has the authority of God He heals by speaking the Words that spoke creation into being This is our God For us today? But what do we with this today? Accept that this is a story that explains the divinity of Christ, and his authority As we get to know more of Jesus during this season between Christmas

and Lent?

But is there more?

Going back to the Gospel of John: John 14:12-14

<sup>12</sup> Very truly I tell you, whoever believes in me will do the works I have been doing, and they will do even greater things than

these, because I am going to the Father. and <sup>13</sup> And I will do whatever you ask in my name, so that the Father may be glorified in the Son. <sup>14</sup> You may ask me for anything in my name, and I will do it. Or in Matthew Matt 28:18-19 <sup>18</sup> Then Jesus came to them and said, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. <sup>19</sup> Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, <sup>20</sup> and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age." Jesus commission to his desciples All authority has been given to me Therefore go and do what I have been doing You are working in and under my authority Do we accept that authority? As you know we have a prayer ministry group And there are occasions that we also need to tell evil spirits to go to from a person

Just like Jesus did And we do this in the name and the authority of Jesus If you believe in Jesus Christ, you have his authority To speak against evil Do we take it? Are we free? Or do we find ourselves like the man with the unclean Spirit? Do we need to be freed from something It could be addicative of compulsive behaviour Not being able to withstand temptations of life Finding ourselves overwhelmed by emotions that are not justified for the situation Anger, fear, guilt, shame If that is you, then you may also want to have prayer ministry As there we ask Jesus to reveal to you what is underneath that all And he can than heal your pain, hurt, anger, fear or whatever it is By speaking his Word into your life
