Prodigal Son

Intro

Today we have a communion and prayer ministry service

And I would like to focus today on the unconditional love of God

Many people, Many Christians cannot get their head around that Jesus really loves them

Even though most of our Songs speak about the Love of Christ for us all

But we think it is for humanity

And do not realise that his love is just also for me

Jesus tried to speak about that when he was alive

John 3:16: For God so loved the world that he gave his only, so that everyone who believes in him, may have eternal life

Another way Jesus spoke about his love is by parables

One of the more famouse ones is the parable of the Prodical (or the

Lost) Son Intro to reading The story starts with the famous "once upon a time" or "There was a man who had two sons And we see the younger son being dissatisfied with his life He wants to leave home and set out on his own. He wants to leave his family and the security Let's go on an adventure! But how do I pay for it? **Cunning Plan** Dad, can you give me already my share of my inheritance, please And the dad, unlike normal dads, does that too The story is unclear about how this happened Did he have to sell real estate or perhaps it was only the Dad's savings But we see that the son gets his fair share Travelling away It only takes a few days and the son emigrates, to a far country If he lived in the UK he might have travelled to Thailand And once there we hear that he lived a life

AND ONCE THEIR WE HEAT THAT HE HVED A HIR of utmost luxury, without considering how much money he had He squandered it Poor And he became poor and had to work! In addition there's a famine so food was not easy to buy or get And we see he gets hungry Working Not having developed any qualitifications and as a stranger He only good work as a farm worker to feed the pigs Note: pigs are unclean animals in Jesus' time So a double humiliation But he was not allowed to eat the food himself that give to the pigs I.e. the pigs had a better life than he! Reading The rest of the story Probably just as unlikely as the beginning? The son comes to his senses If I work at my dad's, i'll be better off And he returns home The Dad is waiting for him - and sees him far off

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TIC SUIT LITES LU HIANG ATTICHUS ATTU confess I am not your son anymore dad, but can I work for you? But the Dad does not seem to listen He forgives him - not in words, but by his actions A ring, a robe, sandals, and a feast There's nor recriminations, no explanations Dead but now alive again; lost and now found That is all that matters That he returned and that he is alive in his Dad's live and in his arms again The elder son The story carries on with the elder Son, and his reaction But I want to stop here And look at the implications of this story for us A Parable This is a parable A picturesque figure of language in which an analogy refers to a similar but different reality Jesus used parables to instruct the

people. A story is easier to internalise and remember, than a cold definition A story inhabits emotion But Jesus' parables almost always explains something about God, about himself or an aspect of the Kingdom of God And here it is easy to imagine that the Son is a human person and that the Father is God The Parable tells our story The story of every human being God is our Father We all have wanted to get away from him We felt life under the Father's way of living hard Too many rules morality No we want to be free And we walked away Travelled as far away from God as we could Knowing that what we are doing is not right But enjoying our life Until it comes to crisis And we find there is something missing that we need The Son began to be in need We assume that it is food and shelter

But maybe it is something more allusive Like fulfilment, purpose, happiness, love, Shalom The peace that passes understanding that comes from being in a relationship with God So we are searching, and humanity is searching and every human being is searching Some call this progress But no one knows what we progress to What is the end state that we are searching for? Foolish or wise? The son was wise not foolish We think that the son is foolish, to leave his Father But he was wise, when he came into need, he know he had to return to his Father Humanity is foolish They carry on searching for things But they discount the one that can bring them fulfilment of their need God in the form of Jesus Christ So what about us?

Most of you would say you are

Christians And you are, because you have said that you believe in Jesus Christ But a lot of Christians stop there The return to the Father As helping hands But the Father is standing there, with the ring, the robe, the shoes and the food You can be my child again! Be we so, we rather work for our living, than you very much We like it here in your neighbourhood Because it is good here But we do not really want you to become our Father To be emotionally involved with God And so we are still searching, still not happy, altough it is better to live in the shadow of God Coming to church Meeting with the people But not really want to meet with the one who loves us so much Come to him

That is what today's prayer

ministry is about Come to him, accept him as your **Father** No, I am not good enough I have sinned, I have done wrong Some of the things I have done I cannot even forgive myself I cannot imagine God forgiving me! So I rather keep my distance The son was forgiven fully He tried to go halfway - I am not good enough to be your son But the Father took him in his arms And reinstated him as Son - no questions asked You are forgiven fully That is the same for us Jesus died on the cross for us To show the depth of despair and depravaty he is willing to go to So that we are willing to accept his forgiveness - because it is real So come, test the Lord, and see if he really wants to forgive Now is the time

The time of communion

remembering that Jesus died for us

The time where we offer prayer ministry

As safe space for you to ask for forgivenes

You do not need to spell it out

The team does not need to know

And God knows already

Just ask him the question: Do you really forgive me, Lord?

Are you willing to try?
